#### 4. Let's celebrate!

In Bob Ellis's "No Lazy Dancing" book, the inspiration for the revival of Buck pub sessions and Dales dance events, he shows how musicians who played the dance tunes often came from families which passed down music making from generation to generation. A great example of this is in the Beresford families

from Upper Wharfedale and Langstrothdale. Several generations of music makers on accordion, concertina, fiddle or piano, from the 1790s to the 1970s and continuing. And it was Peter Beresford (1881 - 1965) from Oughtershaw who established the tradition of music sessions at the Buck. Now we learn that Beresford music making thrives in present generations living beyond the Dales.
