A. Pub Sessions

The Buck - December 9th 2023. Numbers were a bit down for this session, possibly due to many flooded roads in the December 'monsoon'. Nevertheless, it was a happy relaxed session with musicians, singers and poets able to contribute frequently.

Starbotton - Fox and Hounds January 14th 2024. The Buck was unavailable while the heating system was being repaired. Muppett used his persuasive powers to have the January session in the Fox and Hounds instead. Up to 15 people squeezed into a cosy room at the side. Given the name of the pub it felt appropriate for the musicians to play both the Buckden and Grassington versions of the Huntsman's Chorus. However, the main focus at the beginning of the session was our tribute to Bob Ellis who had died earlier in the week. Several members spoke warmly of Bob as a friend, melodeon musician and tutor at folk festivals in Sidmouth and Whitby, and above all as the author of the inspirational history of Yorkshire Dales village dances, the musicians and the tunes they played: There was None of this Lazy Dancing! Folk Tunes and Dances from the Yorkshire Dales. The book is popular among folk musicians country wide and it led to the creation of our own "Collective", the revival of pub sessions at the Buck and a series of Dales Dance events in Kettlewell, Ripley, Arncliffe and Grassington. We'll be back at the Buck on Sunday February 11th.

B. Dales Dance Events in the offing

We put on the widely enjoyed Dales Dance Sunday afternoons in Kettlewell in November 2022 and Arncliffe in October 2023. Now it is Grassington's turn to enjoy the fun. Great tunes and flowing sociable dances in squares, pairs, threesomes or lines for a wide variety of dances.
